Hackney Children's Centres

The place for families with children under five

Children's Centres are for children and their families in Hackney.

By making contact with your local children's centre you can get additional health, family support and education services for you and your children.

See the map to find your closest centre.

Each children's centre will offer the following:

1. Stay and play activities
2. Childcare (Integrated care and education for children 0-5 years)
3. Community outreach
4. Child and family health services
5. Family support services
6. Links with schools and other settings

1. Stay and play activities

The children's centres will have different free drop-in sessions for you and your child.



2. Childcare

Full daycare

8am-6pm, 5 days a week, for a minimum of 48 weeks a year. (You have to pay for this service).

Who is eligible for a place?

- A child aged between 12 weeks and 5 years.
- A child whose parents live or work in Hackney.

How to access a children's centre childcare

- Contact the children's centre you wish your child to attend.
- They will give you an application form and information about fees and tax credits.
- After you have handed in the form, the children's centre will contact you to discuss your needs.
- You will then be placed on the admissions register.

Childminding networks

Childminding networks provide support to registered childminders who have shown they can deliver high quality care. Co-ordinators support the networks of certified childminders. The parents can speak to a co-ordinator about the childminding service.

3. Community outreach

Parental involvement

Working with parents to develop local services.

Training and employment

Encouragement and support to help parents or carers into training and employment:

- raising awareness of information and support available
- signposting to education and training at all levels
- skills training
- links to the Jobcentre Plus
- English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL)

4. Child and family health services

Some of the health services in the children's centres are:

Speech and language therapy

The Speech and Language Therapist can help your child if they are finding it hard to talk. They are based in the children's centre.

Midwifery

- Advice and support for pregnant and new parents, around giving birth, breast feeding, issues around smoking.
- Information leaflets and signposting on to services.

Healthy eating

Nutritionists or Dietitians based in the children's centre will work with children and families to make sure they have an understanding of healthy eating and can assess any food related health problems.

Mental health services

Direct support to children and families e.g. counselling, support to your child in their daycare setting.

Portage service

Portage works with children up to age 3 with a disability and their families in the home to improve a child's development.

5. Family support services

Families with children under 5 will receive a visit from a member of the children's centre multi-disciplinary team. This team will help with any problems. The team includes Family Support Workers, Health Visitors, Nursery Nurses, Portage Workers and Social Workers.

Parenting programmes

There are parenting classes for all parents: new parents or parents with many children.

The parenting programmes:

- support stressed or isolated parents
- support families where there is domestic violence or substance misuse
- support families when they arrive in Hackney from another borough, are asylum seekers or refugees
- support young parents
- support fathers to be involved with their child from pregnancy
- give advice and information about accident prevention
- give financial advice on benefits or debts
- help parents to support their child's learning

6. Links with schools and settings

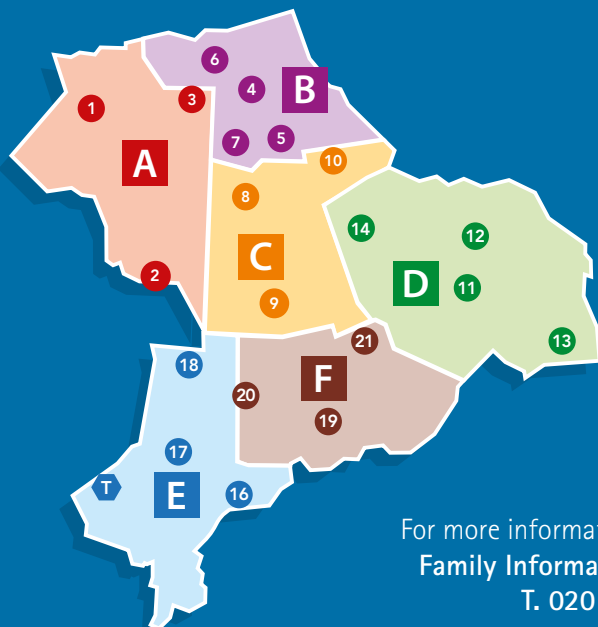
There are links between the children's centres, schools and settings in each children's centre area.

The children's centres:

- support children as they move from daycare to school
- deliver services to staff and children in settings
- give information about children's centre services to parents and staff in schools and other settings
- act as a link between the schools, settings, parents, health and social services providers



There are 6 children's centre areas in Hackney (A, B, C, D, E, F). There is a strategic centre in each area where there is a large team of professionals. You can access information about Midwives, Speech and Language Therapists, Health Visitors from all centres.
