All of the schools in this brochure provide lessons in the core national curriculum subjects; English, Mathematics and Science, with the majority of schools providing additional enrichment activities.

Supplementary education is for all young people at all key stages. Schools provide tuition to all abilities and are a great way for a young person to get additional help outside of school. The teachers employed by the schools listed in this directory are all qualified and have been CRB checked.

In addition to lessons supporting mainstream education, this year several schools are running a cultural education programme. If you would like to find out what's available look at Supplementary Education Works!

If you or your children decide to try supplementary education, this booklet will give you all the information you will need to enrol on a suitable programme.

The Shine on Saturdays Academy is a Saturday school which offers places to children aged 7 to 11. This school is an exciting and intensive learning environment. At The Shine on Saturdays Academy, we want children to feel positive about themselves and their community. The Shine wants to provide a learning environment which will support children to exceed expectations and achieve better than expected results at KS2 SATs.

The Shine on Saturdays Academy includes:

- 3.5 hours Saturday tuition in literacy, numeracy, science and ICT
- Intensive teaching that supports the school's curriculum but feels different to "normal" school.
- Between 3 -5 visits to local places of interest throughout the year (museums, shows, events)
- A snack of a bagel and drink
- Affordable fee for 30 weeks tuition

A fee of £50 per term or £150 per year is required. Some schools in the local area buy places for selected families.

The project was set up to develop and encourage Jewish Orthodox boys to build their self esteem, actualise and maximise their potential, engage with positive behaviour and illuminate Jewish youth slipping into antisocial behaviour.

Youth Direct is devoted to the physical, emotional and social development of children and young people. The activities are designed to improve academic achievement while reinforcing good social skills in an informal environment. The Supplementary School offers Craft design classes as well as learning how to implement numeracy skills in real life situations and national curriculum English lessons.
